

The Electoral Cycle Approach




Supplementary Voters Registration

- Successfully completed the Supplementary Registration of Voters - from the <u>08th – 27th July 2019</u>.
- Provisional voters register displayed at 280 venues countrywide for inspection and objections from <u>02nd – 06th</u> <u>September 2019</u>.
- No objections were recorded.
- The PVR was taken through a series of integrity checks which include the Automatic Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) matching to remove duplicates.
- Process also include manual adjudications in the case of similar fingerprints as well deletion of records of deceased persons.
- Final voters register published in the Government gazette on 06th November 2019.



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




Registered Voters in 2014 By Age







Nomination Process

- Nomination process successfully conducted in terms of Section 72, 73 and 77 of the Electoral Act, Act No 5 of 2014
- Nomination commenced on 01st October 2019
- Date for Independent Candidates 16th October 2019
- Nomination Day/Sitting and Nomination Deadline 18th October 2019.
- Section 77 of the Electoral Act, read together with Articles 46 and 47 of the Namibian Constitution preclude sitting regional, local councilors and remunerated members of the public service from being nominated on party lists for the National Assembly elections
- As a result of this, a number of persons had to resign their positions in order to be retained on party lists

The Ballot Papers



- Foreign Missions 9200 manual ballots for each election
 13th November 2019 – 250 EVM
- Ballots for each election (in-country voting) o 27th November
 - 2019 4000 EVM Ballots for each election



Notice for Withdrawal

- Received request for withdrawal from Presidential Elections from NEEF and RP
- Deadline for the withdrawal of a candidate for Presidential elections is contained in section 73(8) of the Electoral Act, 5 of 2014, and is <u>at any time before the close of the sitting</u> that was conducted on 18 October 2019.
- All political parties were informed on numerous occasions that this was the last day of nominations and it was also gazetted in Government Gazette no. 7008 of 30 September 2019.

13th Nov Voting Process

- In terms of Section 64(2)(c) of the Electoral Act, Act No. 5 of 2014
- Voting at Foreign Missions Total of 34 Polling stations
- Sea-Going Personnel Walvisbay, Luderitz & Oranjemund
- Nampol, NDF, Correctional Services personnel to be deployed for duty on 27th November 2019
- Established 1 Polling station per Constituency, with 2 in certain Constituencies – Total of 154 polling stations

Announcement of Special Day Voting Results

- The polling process at the foreign missions is conducted through manual ballot papers
- Results are managed strictly in terms of the Section 105 (8) of the Electoral Act
- Presiding Officers counted ballots, announced results and posted such results at their polling stations
- Returning Officer for the Foreign Missions currently receiving all election materials used at foreign missions including original results forms
- Returning Officer will be required by law to collate all foreign votes after the close of polls on 27th November 2019 and submit to the Chief Electoral Officer
- Similarly, Presiding Officers in-country announced and posted results at their polling stations before booking in all materials at respective police stations in the presence of political agents
- The ECN will collate and announce such results after they are officially announced by Returning Officers as contemplated in Section 109 and 110 of the Electoral Act.

Polling Stations

- Deploying a total of 2277 polling teams
- Established a total of 4241 polling stations namely:
- 1410 Fixed stations
- 2831 Mobile stations
 served by 867 Teams



Polling Officials

- Polling officials currently undergoing training
- Regional Coordinators, Assistant Coordinators, RO, PO, IT Assistants, HR etc
- Approximately **16,668** officials to be recruited
- The selection is based on academic qualifications and work experience. ECN also take into account Gender, People with Disabilities (PWDs) and persons from marginalized communities.
- Basically recruited all unemployed Namibians with appropriate qualifications

Regions & Constituencies



- 14 Regions
- **121 Constituencies**
- 54 Local Authorities

The Results Trajectory

- Votes are counted and announced at polling stations technically speaking there "election" process ends there
- Each Presiding Officers tallies the results at the polling station and announce results there at the polling station after the closing of polls.
- Each Presiding Officer prints a copy of the results and posts it at the entrance of the polling station.
- The polling station results are then sent to the Constituency Collation Center for tabulation.
- Each Presiding Officer provides the EVM CU used at that particular polling station to be connected to Tabulators.
- At a click of a button, these results are tabulated electronically and printed for announcement at that particular constituency.
- Returning Officer is required to tabulate results and announce results in the prescribed manner for both Presidential and National Assembly elections
- Returning Officer transmits both results to CERC


VVPAT Errors

 For the record, VVPAT technology was not in existence at the time the EVM's were acquired


Irrecoverable Errors

- VVPAT device would not communicate with the EVM
- Printing mechanism simply jams as is often the case with all printing technologies – 'Secrecy of the Vote'
- What should happen if a voter 'complains' that the candidate/party printed of the slip shown at the VVPAT widow is incorrect?
- For the record, the Commission is also in favour of introducing the VVPAT – but not in an irresponsible manner

RMS & Mob App



- One module to be deployed at Collation Centers and another at CERC – To be used for results processing
- Mobile App
- Further information to be provided to the public on these technologies
